performs the action and passive subject receives the action voice is vital for clear and concise writing Active voice is direct and impactful like a punch passive voice is indirect like a gentle push Direct and Indirect Objects Identifying direct receives the action and indirect tofor whom the action is done objects enhances grammatical precision Think of giftgiving the direct object is the gift and the indirect object is the person receiving it Phrases and Clauses Differentiating between prepositional phrases participial phrases gerund phrases infinitive phrases and independent and dependent clauses is critical for analyzing sentence structure Phrases are like smaller units within a larger sentence while clauses are minisentences within a larger sentence Punctuation Correct punctuation is paramount This includes the use of commas semicolons colons apostrophes quotation marks and hyphens
